



Attend Orientation.

STEP 4:
Complete Wayne Township Adult Education online registration; upload driver's license and valid Social Security Card, diploma and transcripts, and written survey responses.

STEP 5:
Complete testing and an interview.

STEP 6:
Wait for a text informing you if you have been awarded a scholarship and a seat in the class.

STEP 7:
IF ACCEPTED INTO A CLASS, attend the required orientation on Thursday, August 6th.
